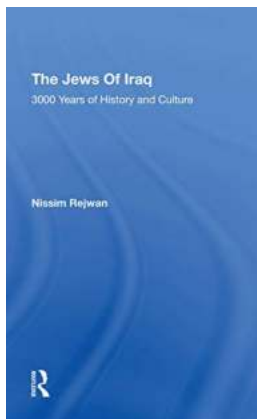
Jalal Al-e Ahmad was born to a clerical religious family in Tehran in 1923. A teacher all his life, Al-e Ahmad was an influential and prolific writer and social critic, whose body of work includes short stories, novels, travelogues,

anthropological studies, essays, reviews, and translations. His best known work is Gharbzadegi (Occidentosis), which has also been translated into English as “Weststruckness” and “Westoxification,” a cultural critique of westernization in Iran. He died in 1969.



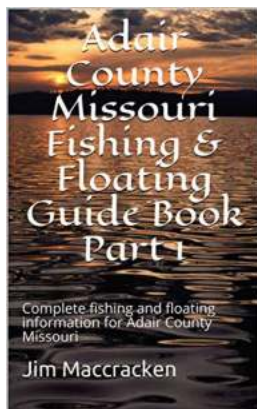
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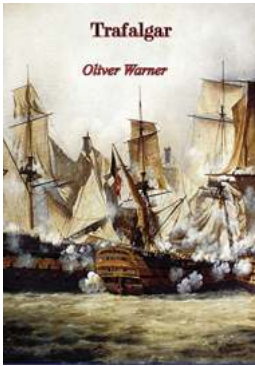
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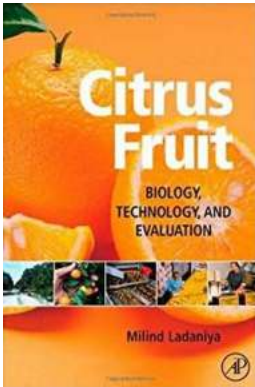
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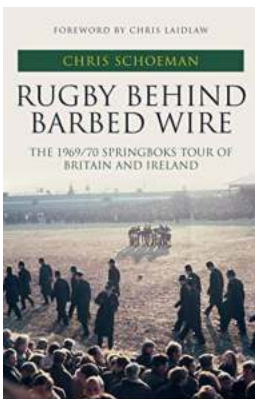
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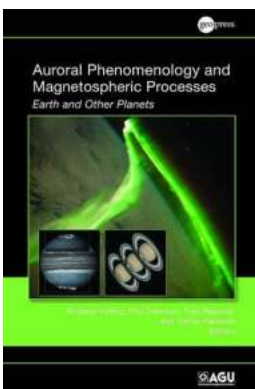
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
