

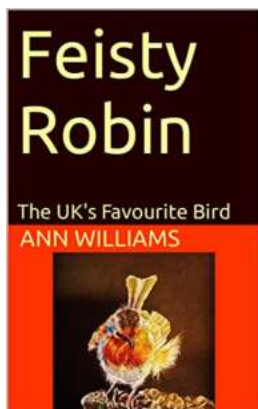

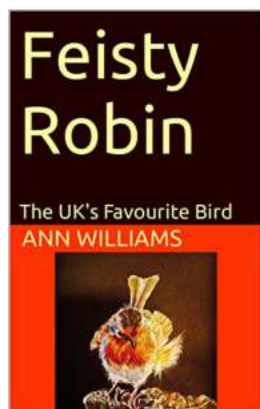

Now retired, she enjoys painting and writing books about things which inspire her, in the lovely Pendle countryside.

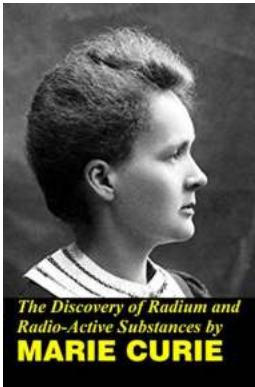
