

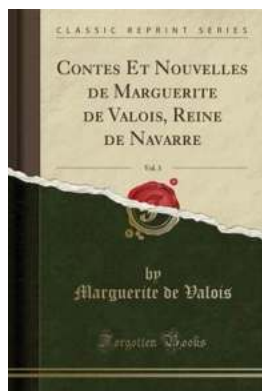

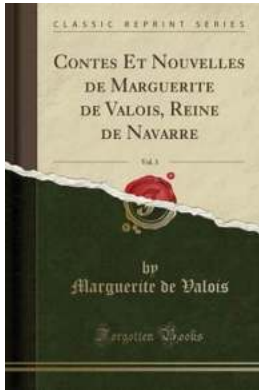

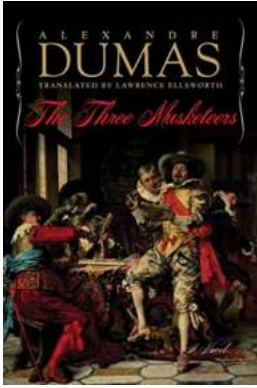
Excerpt from Marguerite De Valois
