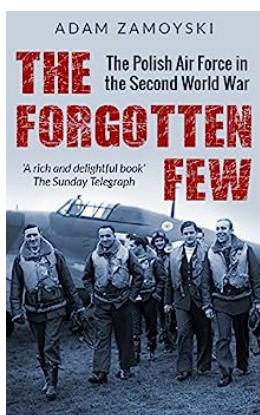
The Rise of the Polish Air Force

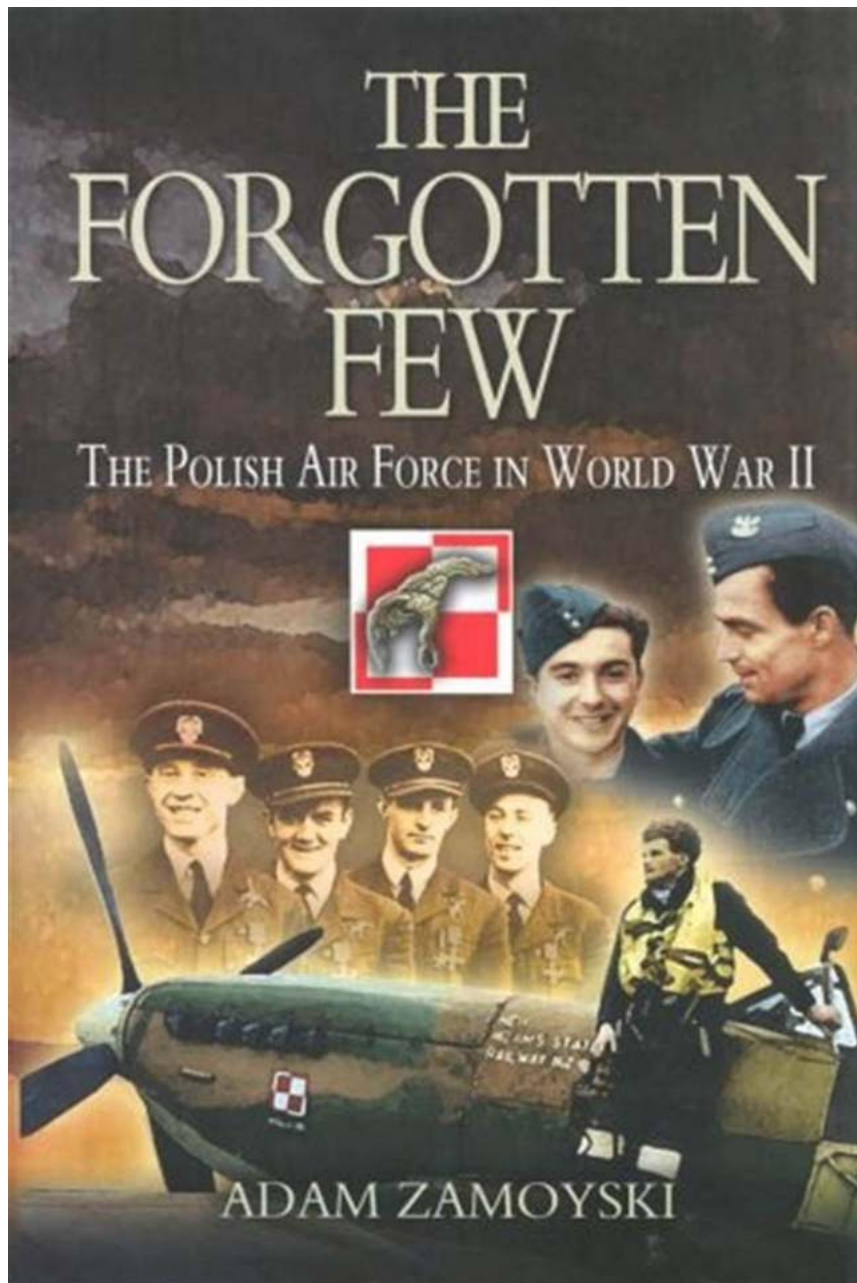

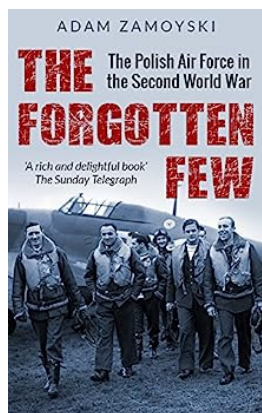

By the beginning of 1941 there was a fully fledged Polish Air Force operating alongside the RAF.
