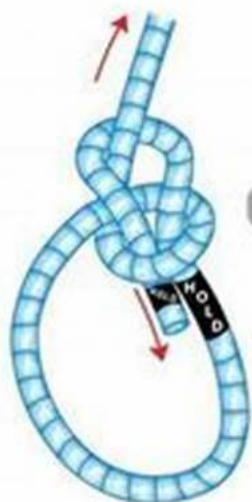
Bowline Knot Directions

2. Reef Knot

How to Tie a Reef Knot:

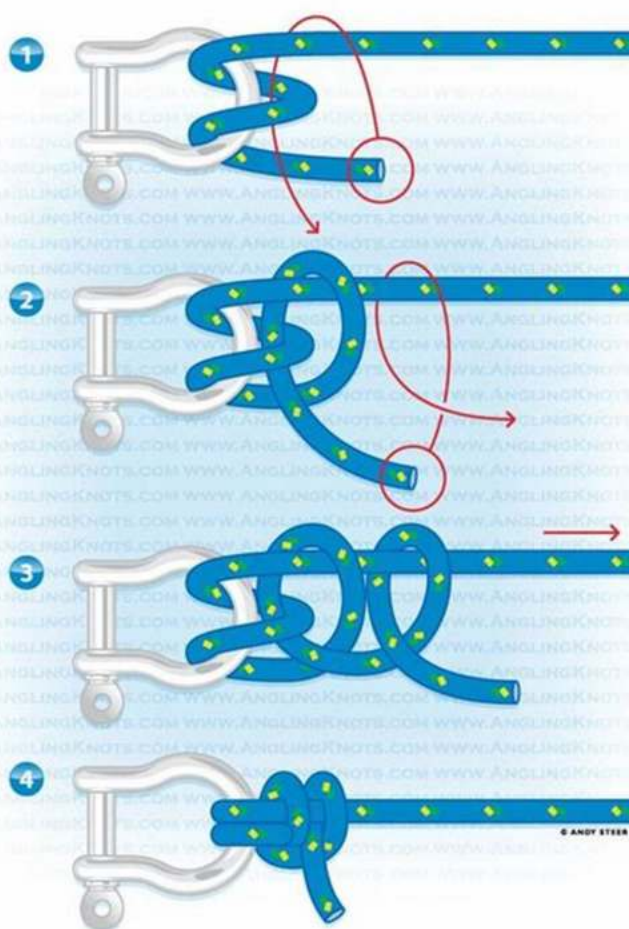
Step 1: Hold the ends of two lines together, ensuring they overlap.

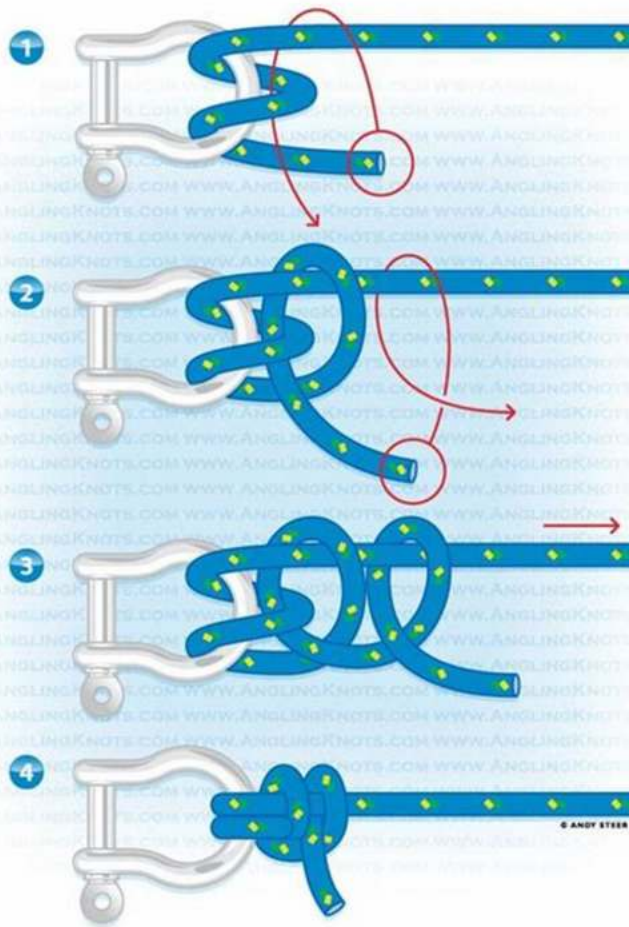
How to Tie a Figure Eight Knot:
