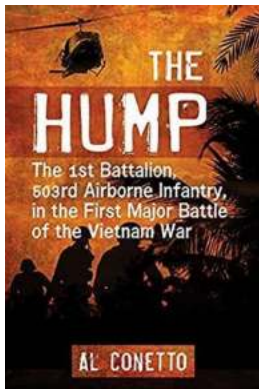


The Pacific Theater in World War II
