

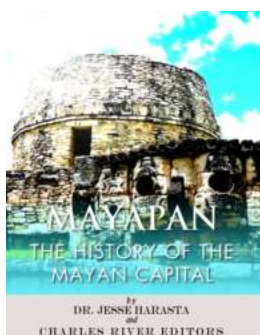

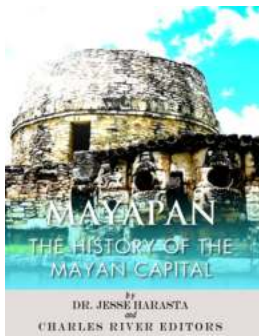

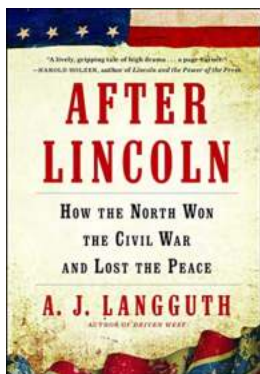
Many ancient civilizations have influenced and inspired people in the 21st century, like the Greeks and the Romans, but of all the world's civilizations, none

This is seen in the fact that many of the most important buildings in the new city appear to be small-scale reproductions of ones in Chichén.

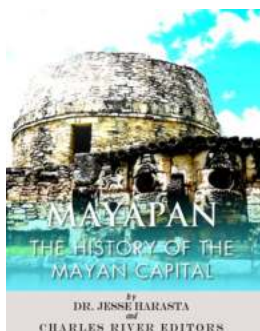
Due in part to the fact that it has long been overshadowed by Chichén Itzá, a lot of excavation and scholarly research on the site has only come about in recent decades, and even though there is still plenty of work to do, a lot of information about life in Mayapán has been unearthed. At its height, Mayapán may have boasted a population of over 15,000, and archaeologists have had their hands full trying to discover and restore the several thousand buildings both inside Mayapán's walls and outside them as well.
