Surpassing a dispassionate listing of atrocities, Rae places the reader within the era. Drawing

on thousands of original sources, The Great Stain tells of repression and resistance in a society based on the exploitation of the cheapest labor and fallacies of racial superiority. Meticulously researched, this is a work of history that is profoundly relevant to our world today.




